Inside the front cover there will be a label stating that the book has been donated by the AA Mid Surrey Intergroup with contact details for the National Helpline and the Mid Surrey website.

I am also looking at the cost to advertise on one or two buses in the Guildford area. This has already been undertaken by AA in Southern Bedfordshire.

Catherine (Vice Chair), myself and others from AA attended an event at Frimley Park Hospital on January 30th 2019 organised by Jon E and the Alcohol Liaison Team. The aim was to attract doctors and other healthcare professionals to attend a short presentation by 2 AA speakers followed by lunch. The turnout was small but hopefully we can build on this for future events at the Postgraduate Centre which is an excellent venue.

In March I have been invited to undertake a presentation to Support Workers and Staff who help people in recovery within the community. Other invitations to talk have also been received which is again very positive.

The Where to Find Cards and Starter packs donated to the 3 Hospital Alcohol Liaison Teams continue to be popular and an important means of spreading the message to patients.

ARMED SERVICES LIAISON OFFICER

My fourth report as MSIG ASLO covers a relatively quiet period although I have dealt with request for advice / support from other ASLOs in the South East.

Nonetheless - 61% of all military personnel remain at increasing risk or above of alcohol related harm, and the military units in MSIG area are no exception.

My main effort has been in establishing contact with my neighbouring ASLOs (where they exist) across the South East Region. This allows us to make sure that Military customers - whether individuals or Units, don't slip between the cracks of the Intergroup or Regional boundaries, and that alcoholics or Unit Health points of contact have an AA representative they can turn to. We now have an effective WhatsApp Group for the South East ASLOs which can help us to also support each other.

I have maintained my contacts with the Health and Wellbeing Point of Contact in Headquarters 11 Brigade based in Aldershot. (The HQ responsible for Army Units across the MSIG area and the South-East Region).

I would be grateful if GSRs pass my contact details on to any member of the fellowship who would be able to support our visits to units.
